#### Popular Christmas Songs That Are NOT in the Public Domain

Believe it or not, these songs (as old and ubiquitous as some of them are) have not yet passed into the Public Domain. The rights for these compositions are still administered by publishers, and a mechanical royalty would need to be paid in order to record and release cover versions of these songs.

"Carol Of The Bells" * by Peter J. Wilhousky & Mykola LeontovichJames Ross Boothe"The lyrics and title of "Carol of the Bells" are copyrighted. The music, a Ukrainian folk song called "Shchedryk," is in the PUBLIC DOMAIN. In order to avoid paying a mechanical royalty, your recording would need to be an instrumental version of the composition, and you could NOT call it "Carol of the Bells.""The Little Drummer Boy" by Katherine K.
